JUNE MEETING

June 3, 1973, the monthly meeting of the Queen City Wheelmen was called to order at 7:40 p.m.

- I. The Treasurer's Report: Balance on hand \$428.10.
- II. Released for club races: It was moved, seconded, and approved that non-members of the QCW who wish to participate in official QCW events (including training rides) must have signed releases. Non-members who are not of age may participate in the first event by signing their own release. If they wish to participate in future events, they must bring with them a release signed by a parent or legal guardian. A standard athlete's release will be used, so that when the non-member wishes to join he or she will need to merely pay the club dues.
- III. Scoring of Club Races for Points: It was moved, seconded and approved that a non-member may ride a maximum of 3 club races before joining the QCW, with points from those 3 races to count.  
It was moved, seconded, and approved that a non-member's ABL of A races and points will not be awarded retroactively when a non-member joins the QCW.
- IV. Enforcing ABL of A rules in Club races: (1) HELMETS - It was moved, seconded, and approved that all participants in Club races (including Time Trials) must wear some sort of protective head gear.  
(2) FEEDING - It was moved, seconded, and approved that ABL of A rules be kept regarding feeding in all club races.
- V. Sponsor Committee: a committee will be formed to begin a search for a sponsor. Tabled until the July meeting.
- VI. Jerseys: It was reported that Larry Carmichael will contact us as soon as the jerseys come in. He has not heard from the manufacturer.
- VII. Racing Committee: The racing committee was asked to suggest a course for a Stage Race by the end of the summer, for use as a possible ABL of A race next season. A club race would be held on the suggested course to determine the feasibility of its use.

It was recommended that we not hold another ABL of A sanctioned race this season, but use the money from the U.C. Criterium for races next year. It was the opinion of those members in attendance that we continue to have the U.C. Criterium be a yearly event.

June 2, 1973 D.C.C. 2-Man Team Time Trial (sponsored by Dayton C.C.)  
 Your editor was there, and let me tell you, it was an exciting event! Two-man teams went off at one-minute intervals, with the best time winning the race. To those of you who have already competed in Q.C.W. Time Trials, you know how it works. For those of you who have never competed in a Time Trial...here's how it goes: You go out on the course and ride as hard and as best you can, trying to beat the clock. There are no tactics involved as there are in a track race or road race. You are by yourself, and the strongest and fastest racer wins. In the 20man T.T., you have a partner, and you work with one other man to obtain the best time. The second man across the line's time is the one that counts, so it involves a lot of team work. You don't know until the times are calculated who has won...because you have to subtract the time you started (ie: 1,2,3, etc., minutes from your final time.) It's really fun, and you should come out to the QCW time trials, and every Friday night at Jamestown, Ohio, the D.C.C. has a time trial. Twelve altogether, & your best 8 times count for the D.C.C. trophy. Who knows, you may go on to the Regionals and the Nationals! Bill Gallagher did in his first year of racing. Our 4 QCW riders, Phil Kennedy, Bill Gallagher, John Gilmer, and Bill Froschauer really showed the other riders up! We are proud of them all!!!!

June 3, 1973 Upper Valley Mall Criterium (sponsored by D.C.C.)  
 Eight Cincinnati riders attended this race. We came home with two FIRSTS and a Second. Results will follow. This race was described as a blood bath. In the Junior race Al Zaffiro went down 2 times, with the second crash bending his rear fork. In the same Junior race, John Gilmer also spilled, putting him out of commission. Two new racers from Cincinnati, Mike Roberts and Mike Wood, entered the Senior "C" race. Mike Wood's crank started to loosen, and he developed a



slow leak in a tire which put him out. Mike Roberts crashed also, which put him out of the running. We all felt badly about everyones troubles. There is the next race, though, and we hope that trouble will look the other way for these fellows. Mike W, and Mike R, were up in the first pack and looking strong when they had difficulties. Hang in there, you two. Due to rain, the course was quite wet up till the Senior "A" race, and lots of riders were going down.

In the Senior "A" race (run together with the Senior "B" race) Ted Waterbury (1972 Junior National Champ who is now a Senior) and Ken Snowden started an early breakaway. Bill Gallagher sprinted to catch them, and the three of them were putting some good distance between them and the chase pack. On the back straightaway, Ken Snowden's tire blew on his front wheel, his rim edge caught the pavement, sending him forward over the handle bars. Ken fell on his head, and was seriously injured. The ambulance took him to the hospital in Springfield, where he was X-rayed. Ken was taken by another ambulance to Kettering, where he lives, and admitted to the hospital there. He has a skull fracture, and will be in intensive care for at least one day, with his stay in the hospital to be one week. We are so distressed by Ken's accident, and hope that he will be up and around very soon. Ken's wife Jenet, gave birth to their first child, a boy (Benjamin Alan) Wednesday, and Ken was to have brought her home from the hospital this afternoon, after he finished racing. In the year that the Gallaghers have known the Snowdens we have become friends, and ~~we~~ our hearts go out to them in this terrible time. Ken will be sorely missed in racing circles until he is able to get back on that Paramount again. And poor Jenet, coming out of the hospital with a new baby, only to find that her husband is hospitalized himself. We are thankful that it isn't any worse for Ken...at least he was able to say a few words to Bill in the emergency room at Springfield. We all wish Ken a very speedy recovery.

There is some good news, though. Watson Nordquist finished 1st in the Veterans Race; Phil Kennedy finished 1st in the Intermediates Race, and Bill Gallagher finished 2nd in the Senior A race. Poor Bill Froschauer cramped up right away in the Senior "B" race, but our resident M.D., Doctor Bill, was able to go to the aid of Ken when he was injured. So there is some good in everything. 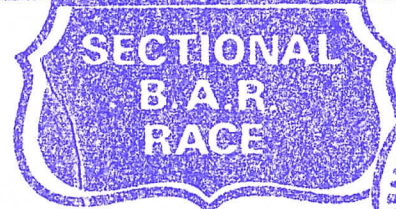
