SPONSORSHIP montgomery cyclery-clifton

Dan Humpert's Montgomery Cyclery-Clifton has signed the contracts and all we need now is approval by the United States Cycling Federation.

Montgomery Cyclery Clifton will be giving the Queen City Wheelmen at least \$1000 in sponsorship money for the 1976 season. Most of the money will be spent on travel expense to and from USCF-sanctioned races. The rate will be \$10 a mile & the club will pay for no more than 400 miles to each car containing three or more QCW USCF racers. Brian Jones (871-7094) will be handeling this and if you need a ride to a race or are driving—even if your car is full—you must tell Brian so he can give approval. D)LUB TIME TRIALS

The club is again holding a 10 mile time trial series. These time trials are one of the many QCW functions the club puts on during the season to x try to generate interest in the club, and to give club members a chance to get together. Also the time x trial series is an excellent way for a rider to improve his speed...also gives me something to organize and write about.

A time trial is an event where the cyclist races against the clock—of course against everyone else also—the winner is the person with the fastest time. The course is a preset distance; and you must ride alone without drafting or following anyone, (i.e. no team tatics). Each rider is started a min. apart; and your goal is to improve your time.

The time trials will be held on tuesdays at 6:00 and the series will start May 4th and run until sometime in september. Anyone may ride these time trials, but after you ride two time trials you will have to join the club.

They will start at the William Henery Harrison State Memorial—in the Cleves and NOrth Bend area—and finish about a mile from the start in cleves. To get there take U.S. 50 (River Road) to the WHHSM exit, and turn left at the first stop sign you come to, (there should be a flashing red light), this should be brower road and the start is just on the other side of the overpass. The Queen City Wheelmen is a United States Cycling Federation (USCF) member club. The USCF is the body which governs all amateur racing in the U.S. and qualifies riders for the Olympics, World Championships, and other international competition. There are no restrictions on age within the club. There is a place for the 8 year old as well as the veteran of 80. Notk only are those wishing to actively race encouraged to join, but also riders interested in doing fast touring, and there is a great need for others interested in promoting the soprt in such facets as helping run a 1 a race and generating publicity.

Every person who participates as a comeptitor in USCT-sanctioned events msut apply fro and hold a seperate amateur racing license, for which an additional annual fee is required by the USCF.. Applications for licenses are available through the club. You do not hove to hold a USCF license to belong to the QCW, and all members of the club whether USCF licenseed or not—may compete against each other in strictly club events.

From the begining of may until september, Midweek club races are held regularly. On sunday's some fo the members travel to various cities to participate in USC sanctionec races. Oher activities include training rides and fast tours.
